Explore the Western U.P. Waterfall Color Tour

This is a fantastic trip to take right from the Big Powderhorn Village with spectacular views of waterfalls, landscapes from the tree tops, the waters of Lake Superior and of course all the brilliance of Fall! The Black River Valley Scenic Byway is a protected road way by the Federal Government & a perfect drive for a color tour!

Take a ride on the **Copper Peak Adventure Ride** to enjoy "the highest, most awe-inspiring, unobstructed vista in the Midwest." Open 7 days a week. Monday-Sunday 10:00 A.M. - 4:30 P.M.

Make sure to stop at the 5 waterfalls (Great Conglomerate Falls, Potawatomi Falls, Gorge Falls, Sandstone Falls, & Rainbow Falls) along the way, each with walking paths leading to them. Every waterfall offers a unique view of the Black River & fall colors.

At the end of the Black River Road is the **Black River Harbor**, offering amazing sights of the Lake Superior & a gorgeous suspension bridge over the river. There is also a picnic area & bathrooms.

<u>Directions</u>: To begin your journey, take the Powderhorn Road North through the village to Black River Road and turn left and follow North.

Lake of the Clouds

Surrounded by the ancient Porcupine Mountains, this lake is a blue gem! Lake of the Clouds is the most photographed feature in the Porcupine Mountains region. It is a breathtaking sight, especially during the fall season! Directions: Take Hwy 2 East to Wakefield and take M28. Follow M28 until Bergland, MI and then take Hwy 64 North. Once you make it to Lake Superior you will take a left and follow the shoreline until you see signs for Lake of the Clouds.

50 Mile Fall Color Tour

Tour Highlights: Little Girls Point, Lake Superior, Gogebic County Forest, Superior Falls & Saxon Harbor. Directions: Take US Hwy 2 West to Lake Road (the intersection with Walgreens & Holiday Gas Station) and take a right onto Lake Road heading North. After about 15 miles you will enter Gogebic County Forest. A little farther is Little Girls Point, where you will have a spectacular view of Lake Superior. Continue West & you will come to Superior Falls & the mouth of the Montreal River. A little farther along will be signs for Saxon Harbor, which is part of the Old Flambeau Trail. (Check with Iron County Development Zone about Saxon Harbor Accessibility) As you return to the main road (Hwy 122) it will intersect with Hwy 2, take a left and it will bring you back to Ironwood.



150 Mile Western U.P. Color Tour



Tour Highlights: Cisco Chain of Lakes, Bond Falls, Porkies & Presque Isle Falls. Directions: Follow Hwy 2 heading East. You will pass through the Ottawa National Forest, with several side roads to travel (maps are available at the Forest Service offices. Then turn North onto Hwy 45 in Watersmeet, MI. In Paulding, MI there will be signs for Bond Falls, which is a spectacular sight! Then you can stay on that road to get to M28 or head back to Hwy 45 N. At the intersection of Hwy 45 & M28, take M28 W to see Agate Falls. Continuing North on Hwy 45 you will end up in Ontonagon, a great place to stop & eat! Take M64 West along the shore of Lake Superior and you will eventually come to Lake of the Clouds on Hwy M-107. Next take South Boundary Road. Be sure to stop at Summit Peak for a fantastic lookout of the fall colors! At the end of South Boundary Road take Cty Rd 519 North 1 mile to walk the waterfalls along the boardwalk. Then you can return to Wakefield on 519 to Hwy M28, then right on Hwy 2. This is a full day tour with unforgettable sights!

Lake Gogebic Fall Color Tour

Lake Gogebic is the Upper Peninsula's largest lake, spanning 18 miles long and 3 miles wide and is about 38 miles to get around it. You can start your tour from either end of the lake. Directions: Start off going East on Hwy 2. To start at the North end of the lake take M28 off of Hwy 2 in Wakefield and follow until M64 or Berglund, MI. To start at the South end of the lake, take Hwy 2 past Wakefield to M64 off of Hwy 2. Be sure to stop at one of the many fantastic restaurants around the lake as you are on you tour!
